Family Camping at Scouter's Point

Families may wish to camp at Scouter's Point, an area near the Winter Lodges, while their Scout is in camp. Camping trailers and tents are also allowed at sites assigned by the Camp Ranger. Electricity is available with a shower and restrooms in Baden Powell Lodge. The fee is \$50 per week or \$15 per day. Reservations should be made with the Camp Director at the Office Hours telephone number listed above.

Camp Phillips 2010

To present in Dean Medical Center Parking Lot, 752 North High Point Road

- Sack lunch and beverage to eat and drink when we arrive at Camp Phillips
- Medications and instructions (Mr. Fargo will collect)
- Rain gear (put in the top of your bag so you can show your patrol leader)

Scout Gear

- Complete Class A Uniform: shirt, shorts or pants, belt, socks, neckerchief with slide. Like all Troop outings, uniform inspection will occur before boarding the bus and Camp Phillips rules require complete uniform for evening supper
- Order of the Arrow sash, if OA member
- Scout Handbook
- Notebook and pencils for merit badge work
- Merit badge book, if you already own it; or Troop Library books will be provided

Clothing

- Sturdy, comfortable athletic or hiking shoe (Camp rules require shoes at all times except at the swimming beach)
- Sandals for swimming beach
- Swim suit; goggles, if desired
- Six pairs of socks
- Six pairs of underwear
- Extra shorts and pants
- Extra shirts, Class B Scouting shirts preferred
- Sweatshirt and jacket
- Pajamas
- Handkerchieves

Personal Gear

- Suit case with wheels works best or duffle bag or backpack
- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Fitted twin sheet to put around mattress
- Personal toiletries: toothpaste and brush, soap, shampoo, comb, etc.
- Towel and wash cloth
- Dirty laundry bag
- Light rope for clothes line to dry wet clothes (cannot hang clothes in cabins)
- Flashlight and/or headlight with extra batteries
- Compass, if you own one and are a First Year Scout or taking Orienteering
- Pocket knife and Totin' Chip (First Year Scouts will earn Totin' Chip at Camp)
- Wrist watch, required (*Mr. Scoutmaster what time is it? It's time to bring your watch to Camp!*)
- Water bottle or canteen
- Daypack to carry water bottle, swim suit, merit badge work, etc.
- Spending money for trading post & fast food lunch on trip home

Personal Gear (continued)

- First Year Scouts must give Mr. Fargo their money in a labeled envelope for safekeeping; older Scouts can safekeep their own money or they can have an adult leader assigned to their campsite safekeep it; however, just remember that adult may not be available when money is actually needed.
- Troop 420 will supply sunscreen and mosquito repellent and both will be placed in a nylon bag under the shelter at each campsite.

Optional Gear

- Camera (disposable cameras work well)
- Fishing gear, if desired
- Postcards or envelopes with stamps to send home to family
- Sunglasses and wide brimmed hat for additional sun protection
- Bible or prayer book

Items Prohibited by Camp Phillips Rules and Regulations

- Firearms: Camp provides rifles, ammunition, and archery equipment at the Shooting Sports area. Under no circumstances should ammunition be brought to Camp. Scouts may bring a bow and/or a .22 caliber rifle that can be loaded singularly (semi-automatic rifles are not permitted) for merit badge work only. Upon arrival at Camp, bows & rifles must be checked at Administration Building.
- Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs are not permitted; possession of these substances on Camp property will be cause for removal from Camp.
- Smoking is not allowed anywhere on Camp property.
- Fireworks, skateboards, in-line skates, bicycles, & boom boxes are not permitted.

Items Prohibited by Troop 420 Policy on the Bus and at Camp Phillips

- Electronic games and devices (Gameboy, PSP, etc.)
- Music listening devices (CD players, MP3 players, iPods, tape players, etc.)
- Martial arts devices
- Large knives
- Adult only magazines

If a Scout chooses to bring a prohibited item to Camp, when found, the item will be confiscated and the parent(s) of Scouts will be immediately contacted to retrieve their son from Camp. If in doubt, contact Scoutmaster Darryl Fargo before you bring it.

Although not prohibited yet, Scouts should leave cell phones at home. If there is a need for a Scout to call home, one of our adults can help make arrangements for a call.
