- 1:30 PM Transport personal gear to campsites, sweep out cabins
- 2:30 PM Swim check and camp tour
- 8:30 PM Opening Camp Show

- 6:15 PM Supper (full Class A uniform required)
- 7:30 PM Elective camp wide programs and troop activities
- 10:00 PM Taps and lights out

Troop 420 Camper Packing List - Camp Phillips 2026

To present in Dean Medical Center Parking Lot, 752 North High Point Road

- Sack lunch to eat after we arrive at Camp Phillips.
- Medications in original container and dosage instructions (Mr. Fargo will collect).
- Rain gear (have easy access to it so you can show your patrol leader).

Scout Gear

- Complete Class A Uniform: shirt, shorts or pants, belt, socks, neckerchief with slide or bolo tie. Like all Troop 420 outings, uniform inspection will occur before boarding the bus and your uniform is worn on the way to and from camp. Camp Phillips rules also require complete Class A uniform for evening supper.
- Order of the Arrow sash, if OA member.
- *Scout Handbook*.
- Notebook and pencils for merit badge work.
- Merit badge related materials.

Clothing

- Sturdy, comfortable athletic or hiking shoes: Camp rules require shoes at all times except at the swimming beach.
- Sandals for swimming beach only.
- Swimsuit and goggles (have easy access to it for Sunday swim check).
- Six pairs of socks and six pairs of underwear.
- Extra shorts and pants.
- Extra shirts, Class B Scouting-related shirts preferred.
- Sweatshirt and jacket.
- Pajamas.
- Handkerchief.

Personal Gear

- Suitcase with wheels or duffle bag with shoulder strap, or a backpack work well.
- Fitted twin sheet to put around mattress.
- Sleeping bag and pillow.
- Personal toiletries: tooth paste and tooth brush, soap, shampoo, comb, etc.
- Towel and wash cloth.
- Small bag to carry toiletries, clean clothes, and towel to and from shower house.
- Dirty laundry bag.
- Flashlight and/or headlight with extra batteries.
- Pocket knife and Totin' Chip (First Year Campers will earn Totin' Chip at Camp).
- Wristwatch. (*What time is it? It's time to bring your watch to Camp!*).
- Personal first aid kit made in Tenderfoot Requirement 4d.
- Water bottle.
- Daypack to carry water bottle, merit badge work, and personal items.
- Spending money for trading post & fast-food lunch on trip home.
- Wide brimmed hat for sun protection.
- Troop 420 will supply sunscreen and mosquito repellent, and both will be placed in a nylon bag under the campsite shelter.

Optional Gear

- Camera (disposable cameras work well and yes, Target still sells them).
- Light rope for clothesline to dry wet clothes.
- Playing cards and/or board games.
- Fishing gear (required if Scout is taking the Fishing merit badge).
- Postcards or paper and envelopes with stamps to send home to family.
- Sunglasses.
- Bible or prayer book.

Discouraged Items

- Cell phones. Although not prohibited, Scouts are encouraged to leave cell phones at home. If there is a need for a Scout to call home, a Troop 420 adult leader can make arrangements for a call. A cell phone can be used as a camera by a Scout, but if it is used for texting, surfing the internet, for posting to social media, the phone will be held by a Troop 420 adult leader until the end of Camp

Items Prohibited by Camp Phillips Rules and Regulations

- Firearms: Camp provides rifles, ammunition, and archery equipment at the Shooting Sports area. Under no circumstances can ammunition be brought to Camp.
- Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs are not permitted; possession of these substances on Camp property will be cause for removal from Camp.
- Tobacco products. Smoking is not allowed anywhere on Camp property.
- Fireworks, skateboards, roller blades, & boom boxes are not permitted.
- Inappropriate t-shirts, excessive jewelry, laser pointers, excessively large knives, and aerosol cans are also not permitted.

Items Prohibited by Troop 420 Policy While Traveling and at Camp Phillips

- Electronic games.
- Music listening devices (CD players, MP3 players, iPods, tape players, etc.).
- Martial arts devices.
- Adult only magazines.
- Canned carbonated beverages and sweet drink containers in campsite or cabin.

If a Scout chooses to bring a prohibited item to Camp, when found, the item will be confiscated and the Scout's parent(s) will be immediately contacted to retrieve their son from Camp. If in doubt, contact a Troop 420 adult leader before you bring it.

Family Picnic Dinner on Friday, July 17, 2026

On Friday, parents and friends can join their Scout(s) for the events culminating their week at Camp Phillips. The outdoor picnic dinner, chapel service, and Order of the Arrow ceremony are highlights of the evening. Payment for the 5:30 PM outdoor picnic dinner can be made in advance through the Troop 420 leaders for \$8.00 per person or in person at Camp Phillips for \$10.00.

Family Camping at Scouter's Point

Families may wish to camp at Scouter's Point (a camping area near the Winter Lodges) while their Scout is in camp. Camping trailers and tents are allowed at sites assigned by the Camp Ranger. Electricity is available along with a shower and restrooms in Baden Powell Lodge.

The fee is \$300.00 per week or \$75.00 per day. The rental period begins at 12:00 noon on Sunday and ends by 9:00 a.m. the following Saturday. Reservations should be made with the Camp Director. Special arrangements may be made for a longer stay if desired.

Family campers at Scouter's Point are expected to confine their activities to that area. Families not wishing to cook may purchase meal tickets in advance from the Administration Building and eat in the Camp Dining Hall. Occasional visits to the main part of camp are welcome, but only during reasonable hours.

Leaders attending camp with their unit may sleep in campers and trailers that are parked at Scouter's Point as long as there are two leaders staying in the campsite at all times. Sites at Scouter's Point are assigned by the Camp Ranger.
